Treasurer's Report

Ewan told the meeting that the account held £678 at present. The Heritage Exhibition collected £242. Sale of the newsletter amounted to £13.15. £40 was spent on the film night. The advertisement board had two slots still to be filled.

Heritage Exhibition

Ian thanked all who participated in the successful exhibition. The response from the local people was remarkable along with visitors from further afield. The press coverage was extensive including BBC Alba which covered interviews from residents who were reminiscing about Glendale. The Free Press covered the exhibition in two

editions along with the Oben Times and Cullin FM who interviewed Ian twice. The meeting thanked Nick Carter for the poster and also the residents who gave of their time to put pictures up and cover the opening hours. Discussions followed on how to progress the position and the meeting believed pursuing Highland Council in respect of Borrodale School and the port-a-cabin was the way forward. It was believed a Council report would be presented to the Councillors in October. It was also agreed that the Heritage Committee draw up a business plan to support a case for funding to create a permanent exhibition in the future. Natalie was thanked for the cataloguing work and it was agreed that copyright status be attached to all material attached to the heritage exhibition.

Hall Committee

Kathy Lindsley came along to discuss common areas where the trust and the hall committee could work together. It was decided that an evening in November could be arranged jointly. A ceilidh with local musicians was agreed. Kathy was to arrange the license and Ian the music. Printing tickets would have to be organised as well as advertising the event. Kathy informed the meeting that a Halloween function has been organised by Kathy Quirk. This event will be for the children initially and then adults later in the evening.

Website

It was agreed that everyone had a part to play in the upkeep of the website but Graham would maintain it at present. It was agreed to add as an agenda item "Updating the Website".
