Glendale to the World: Dr Magnus Maclean and his contribution to modern science. Magnus Maclean was born at 19 Fasach, Glendale on 1st November 1857 and died in Glasgow on 2nd September 1937. As an academic and researcher at the Universities of Glasgow and Strathclyde he was one of the leading scientists of his age. He taught both the first Director General of the BBC, John Reith, and the inventor of television, John Logie Baird. Maclean played a key role in many of Lord Kelvin's later experimental work in Glasgow, notably electrical signalling, telegraphy and electro-magnetism and was the founder of the Department of Electrical Engineering at Strathclyde University. A noted Gaelic scholar, he also became the first Lecturer in Celtic at Glasgow University and was the only person to have attended the inaugural meetings of both An Comunn Gaidhealach and the Gaelic Society of Glasgow. He published several books on Celtic Studies as well as on physics and electronics.
